FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

**DEVOTION TO MARY, MOTHER
OF GOD---**

Because of Mary's unique role in
salvation history, Catholics have a
deep love and devotion to Mary.
Most notably, Mary trusted God,
and trusted her Son. She was, and
is, open and trusting to whatever
God wishes for her. She is the
greatest instrument of God, having
said "yes" to being the Mother of
God. She also intercedes for us,
guiding us closer to her Son.

Many people pray the Rosary;
some do pilgrimages, some display
Mary's statue or image in their
homes and gardens even; and
some pray to Mary, to bring them
closer to Jesus. What better friend
have we, than the Mother of the
One we seek to be more like!
The Rosary, as are all other
devotions to Mary and the Saints,
are *private* devotions. Which means
that each individual will honour the
Mother of God as their heart
directs.

We must remember that Mary is
our *intercessor*. Some decades ago,
and even recently, some Catholics
called Mary a "co-Redeemer". She
is not. Mary is the sinless, gentle
human mother who prays for us;
but Mary cannot heal or forgive us--
that comes from God. But Mary's
prayers are powerful for us--she
asks the Lord always to be with us,
and for us to always hunger for
Him.
