Fr. Michael's Sunday reflection:

Today, Jesus identified, touched, and healed a leper. The most dangerous disease in his time. The case of the Coronavirus disease like being infectious, report to health professionals, isolation, face mask and social distancing can help us understand the plight of a leper. In a traditional Jewish culture, leprosy is a disease associated with social stigma of segregation, separation, discrimination and isolation, likewise religious inferences of spiritual impurity, uncleanness, and defilement. This can help us appreciate why Christ's healing the leper is the highest form of compassion, empathy, and sympathy. By telling the leper to show himself to the priest, Jesus reminds us again about the need to show ourselves to the priest at the confessional for absolution from sin which is a spiritual leprosy. His compassion

challenges us to reach out with affection to the neglected, the downtrodden, the aged, the sick, the dying and indeed all those in need in our society. Again, we are encouraged to break the walls of separation and discrimination amongst us.

As we gradually enter the season of Lent, through the church, may Christ continue to touch our life and restore us back to the household of God.

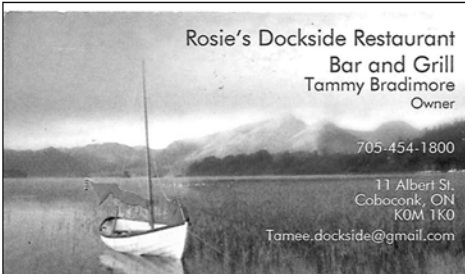
